Autumn 1	
Caring	- Faith is a strong belief or trust in someone or something. - A Faith community is a group of people sharing the same religion. - Christianity is a religion. - Judaism is a religion. - Faith communities believe it is important to show care towards other people.
Autumn 2	
Belonging	- Belonging means feeling like you fit in and belong somewhere. - Anyone can belong to a religion. - Christians believe in one God. - A religious ceremony is a special event that takes place within a religion. This could be a celebration such as a wedding. - An infant Baptism is a Christian ceremony where an infant or baby is baptised.
Spring 1	
Families	- Families are all different. - Some families are religious, and some families are non-religious. - Christians see Church as a family. - Christians believe that they belong to God. - Christians turn to God when they need support by going to Church or saying a prayer.
Spring 2	
Celebrations	- Celebrations are a way to mark or remember a special moment. - Christians celebrate special moments from Bible stories. - Easter is a Christian celebration that remembers when Jesus rose from the dead. - Passover is a Jewish celebration where Jewish families celebrate together.
Summer 1	
Answers	- Christians believe that Jesus is the Son of God. - Christians believe that Jesus is a special person in their religion and that he did good things for others. - There are stories about Jesus in the Bible. - Jesus had some special friends, and he called them his disciples. - Believers read Bible stories when they need support.
Summer 2	
Worship	- Worship brings people of the same faith together and is a way to show devotion to their religion or beliefs. - Each religion will have a special day to attend worship. - Christians go to a church on a Sunday to worship. They pray to their God and read stories from the Bible. - Believers of the Jewish faith go to a Synagogue on a Saturday to worship. They pray to their God and read stories from the Torah.
