



PE and Sports Premium report 2024- 2025

Funding received: £17,400

Key Indicator 1: The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity

Actions Taken:

- Sports Equipment: Multiple purchases ensured children had access to high-quality equipment during PE sessions and break and lunch times. This included safer and adapted equipment for inclusive participation (£8495)
- Sporting Events Competition: Funding for transport and staffing allowed consistent access to inter-school events including cross country, basketball, netball, rounders and fishing (£275)
- External Coaches provided targeted activities for pupils during after school clubs to increase physical activity, encourage team work (£2,100)
- Extra booster swimming sessions for children providing extra instructors (£700)

Impact:

- Increase in participation rates in physical activities on the playgrounds.
- Improved attitudes toward health and fitness.
- Pupils able to try new sports and develop new interests.
- Increase in weekly participation at clubs
- Improved attitudes toward health and fitness.
- More pupils are able to swim.

Key Indicator 2: The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole-school improvement

Actions Taken:

- Sport Day Events, Certificates & Badges: Celebrated achievements, encouraging effort and progress in PE (£35).
- Internal Trust Competitions: Organised inter-school competitions within the trust to raise excitement and aspiration (£175).
- Participation in an inter-school games competition for SEND pupils with a reluctance to take part in physical activity. Staff and Travel costs (£230)

Impact:

- Pupils show greater enthusiasm and participation in physical activities included children with mental health and special educational needs
- Engagement in sport has supported students' confidence and emotional well-being
- Increased visibility and value of sport within the school culture.
- Children more motivated and engaged in physical activity.

Key Indicator 3: Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

Actions Taken:

- Professional Development: (£3565) invested in release time to allow Teachers to observe and co-deliver sessions with PE specialists, building their confidence and skillset.
- 1 day course for P.E lead to allow participation in the 'Fishing for Families' fishing project organised by the local School Games Organiser in partnership with the Canal & River Trust (£350)

Impact:

- Teachers show improved subject knowledge and confidence.
- Quality of PE lessons improved through better planning and delivery.
- Aimed at Pupil Premium families, the project introduced pupils and family members to fishing and encouraged them to take up the sport with the aim of improving relationships, mental health and confidence.

Key Indicator 4: Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

Actions Taken:

- Get Set 4 PE Subscription: Ensured access to a progressive, inclusive and broad curriculum programme (£585).
- Attending events to expose children to new sports. (£230)
- See 'Fishing for Families Project' above – transport (£110)

Impact:

- Children exposed to a greater variety of sports and physical challenges.
- Positive feedback from children about trying new activities.
- Increased uptake in after-school clubs.
- Participation in sport is helping students build confidence and manage their emotions more effectively
- Pupils have taken up sports as a hobby outside of school
- Pupils talk positively about sports.

Key Indicator 5: Increased participation in competitive sport

Actions Taken:

- Trust-wide Competitions: Internal competitions organised within the academy trust promoted teamwork and fair play (£230).
- School Games Subscription: Ensured access to a range of local and national competitive events (£300).
- Participation in competitions/events: Regular competitive events including netball, basketball, football, rounders and cross country (included above).

Impact:

- More children participating in competitive sport.
- Pupils developing leadership skills and teamwork.
- Stronger sporting identity and representation for the school.

Summary of Spending

Total Spend: £17,380

Impact: The funding has enhanced provision, increased pupil engagement and raised the profile of sport across the school. It has supported staff development and broadened opportunities for all pupils, with a sustained focus on participation, competition, and inclusion.

This year, a significant portion of the funding was invested in resources and CPD for the staff. The introduction of new resources along with the purchase of inclusive and high-quality sports equipment, led to a marked increase in pupil participation and the development of new sporting interests. Regular competitions and events have further encouraged involvement and fostered a sense of pride and achievement.

The impact has been especially noticeable in pupils' emotional well-being, with increased self-confidence and stronger relationships—especially among those with SEND or eligible for Pupil Premium.

Additionally, participation in competitive opportunities within the school trust and beyond has strengthened teamwork and leadership skills..
